 - A. When you observe injustice, remember that God is the final judge. *Ecclesiastes 3:16-17*
 - B. When you are faced with your own mortality, remind yourself to enjoy life. *Ecclesiastes 3:18-22*
 - C. When you witness oppression, comfort those who are oppressed. *Ecclesiastes 4:1-3*
 - D. When you get caught up in human rivalry, take some time to relax. *Ecclesiastes 4:4-6*
 - E. When you are lonely, find a friend. *Ecclesiastes 4:7-12*
 - F. When you experience a season of popularity, do not expect it to last. *Ecclesiastes 4:13-16*
2. Three principles that will help you live sensibly the next time the world does not make sense to you.
 - A. Draw near to God with a learner's heart. *Ecclesiastes 5:1*
 - B. Stay calm because God is in control. *Ecclesiastes 5:2-3*
 - C. Keep your word because God does not forget. *Ecclesiastes 5:4-7*
